SPECIAL PROJECTS FUND

If there's a story you want to tell, a film or videotape you want to make and you need advice or perhaps financial support, the Co-operative may be able to help through its 'Special Projects Fund'. "The intention of the fund is to provide financial and technical support for original media projects, particularly by people living and/or working in Melbourne's western suburbs."

Individuals and community groups are eligible to apply. Decisions on applications to the fund are made at general meetings of Western Co-operative Limited. For information ring 36 9640 weekday mornings.

The first project supported by the Fund is a one-hour videoplay on political oppression and human freedom. It's called <u>'The Spider and the Fly'</u> and is written and produced by Robert Manderson. The set is being built at the Co-operative's space at the Yarraville Community Centre.

what's New ?

We have received a grant for new equipment from the Australian Film Commission. It should help better videorecording and editing.

The main things we are buying are

- a new portapak
 - to replace one too tired to go any further
- * a new video edit deck
- to give easier editing
- * a flying-spot scanner
 - to copy Super 8 film onto videotape
- * a video van

actually a caravan shell we will turn into a go-anywhere media centre: for on-the-spot teaching, recording, replaying audio/video.

It looks a very tight year for money, but we hope to employ someone we are calling (until we think of a better title) a 'video systems worker'.

Their main work will be

- * to run a low-level maintenance program on the Co-operative's equipment
- * to keep-up communication between the various points in the 'access network'
- * to assist videomakers with productions.

We'll know by the end of September whether we can.

List of Charges for use of Western Communications Resources. Decided at general meeting of Co-operative on 14th. June 1977. (Replaces 9/8/76 list).

To Individual Videomakers: -

Videomakers must register with the Co-operative: Annual Fee \$10 for adults, \$5 for videomakers under 18 years and pensioners.

No equipment hire charges are made for non-profit projects.

To Commercial and Government Organizations: -

*\$30 per day to borrow a portapak. *\$30 per day to borrow a playback deck & monitor. *\$30 per day to borrow a videocassette deck & monitor. *\$30 per day to borrow a colour monitor. *\$30 per day to use studio for production/editing.

Alterations to charges for special projects can be decided by general meeting.

To Other Bodies:-

Representatives of schools wishing to use video in ordinary programs will usually be asked to first try to borrow equipment from a nearby school. At present no charges are being made.

For other groups - special arrangements can be made at Western Communications access points.
