Williamstown primary school, which has been renovated by Community Outreach (it is an old house), a group of people associated with the school concerned that the school's resources should be used by the community. The facilities of the studio include an editing/control room, which houses a half-inch editing system; special effects and mixing console with genlocking facility; audio mixing and dubbing facilities. This room has an observation window through to a large multi-purpose room which we will use as a studio and share with other people such as community outreach, a music group, mother's club, etc. The control/ editing room is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Access to the studio/multi-purpose space is by arrangement with Community Outreach and we gave presently arranged to use it from Thursday through Monday each week. We have presently negotiated to borrow studio cameras

from Carlton Video Centre for a minimum of four days per fortnight, to facilitate a production schedule based upon a number of local groups using the studio space. Other groups who wish to use the studio may be able to fit into these times, otherwise the space would be available on alternate weekends, but people would have to borrow cameras if they wished to do studio production work. The editing system is set up permanently, and is available by contacting Western


